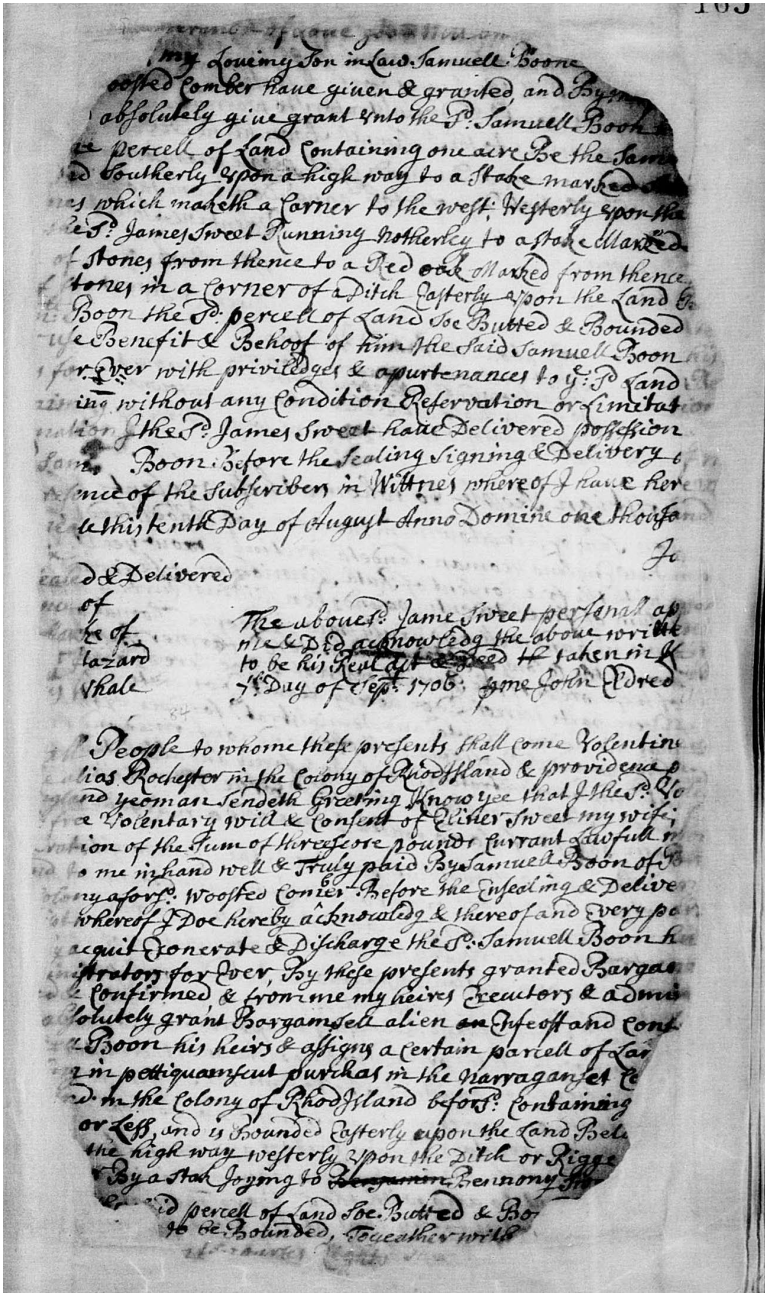


Deed Between Valentine Sweet and his wife Eleanor to Samuel Boone of Woosted Corner,
South Kingstown, Rhode Island

This deed from the *North Kingstown, Rhode Island Land Records* documents the sale of land from **Valentine Sweet** and his wife **Eleanor** to **Samuel Boone of Woosted Corner, South Kingstown**. While earlier genealogists mistook this transaction as proof that Samuel Boone married Valentine's daughter, modern examination of the burned colonial document page shows it sits directly beneath a separate deed from James Sweet, which officially confirms James Sweet as Boone's actual father-in-law. [To all] People to whome these presents shall come Valentine Sweet alias Rochester in the Colony of Rhode island & providence and Yeoman Sendeth Greeting Know yee that I the sd Voluntary Will & Consent of Elinor Sweet my wife , ation of the sum of three pounds Current Lawfull to me in hand well & Truly paid by Samuel Boon of Bo colony aforso **Woosted** Corner . Before the Ensealing & Delive whereof I Doe hereby acknowledge & thereof and every par acquitonerated Discharge the s. Samuel Boon her istrators for ever , By these presents granted Bargane confirmed & from me my heirs Executors & admin solutely grant Bargain Sell alien enfeoff and Cont Boon his heirs & assigns a certain parcell of Law in pettiqumput purchas in the Narraganset . In the Colony of **Rhode Island** before containing or less , and is Bounded Easterly upon the Land Be the high way westerly upon the ditch or Digge By a Stake Joying to Vergain Penny ed parcell of Land soe Butted & Bo to be pounded , Together with
